Human Anatomy & Physiology Course Expectations

Course Description

Human Anatomy & Physiology is a year-long course designed to provide students with a detailed understanding of the structure and function of the human body. Topics will include organization of the body, covering, support, and movement of the body, regulation and integration of the body, maintenance of the body and continuity. The study of other organisms is often included to complement student understanding of the human body. Laboratory investigations include dissection, microscopic observation, and testing capabilities of the various body systems.

In Human Anatomy & Physiology, quarter grades will be determined by a points system in the following manner:

\*The end of course assessment exam (Final) will count for a percentage of each student's semester grade. (Each quarter is worth 40%, and the final exam is worth 20% of the overall semester grade.)

## Class Procedures

When students enter the classroom each day, they are expected to take their assigned seat, have their completed homework turned in to google classroom, and read the board for information about the lesson for the day. Students will only use the iPads when instructed to do so. All classroom policies will be listed in the classroom and discussed with the students. All school rules such as cellphone policy, uniform policy, etc. will be enforced in the classroom.

## Homework

Homework and lab reports are significant parts of the grade and should always be completed to the best of the student's ability. They are assigned for the purpose of reinforcing what is taught in class and will allow students to take what they have learned and enhance it by thinking about it in different ways. It is expected that all assignments are taken seriously and completed as proficiently as possible. Regular Homework will not be accepted late and students will be given a grade of zero for the homework assignment. Labs and other projects will be accepted up to one week late but the grade will be dropped a complete letter grade for each day in which it is late. Not only will homework and labs help a student to stay engaged in class, but it will also be valuable outside of school and in future endeavors as students strive to develop a strong work ethic. Failure to do homework not only impacts the homework grade but also ultimately impacts test grades negatively. Homework prepares you for tests.

### RenWeb Google Classroom/BNI Email

RenWeb and Google Classroom will be used as a communication and organization tool for grades for Forensics class. Students and parents should check RenWeb consistently to be aware of grades. Class assignments, reminders, and announcements will be communicated to students via their Google Classroom.
